L'affinité entre Shakespeare et les Arméniens fait son

apparition dès le XVIIIe siècle.

En effet, Hovsep Emin (1726-1809) un Arménien né en Iran et établi à Calcutta publie en 1792 un livre (*The life and adventures of Joseph Emin, an Armenian*) dont un chapitre est intitulé "Emin dans le rôle d'Othello".

Plus tard, en 1822, paraît la traduction des extraits des œuvres de Shakespeare dans la revue "Chdemaran" (Grenier) également à Calcutta.

"Armenian Shakespeare association", fondée en 2016 organise cette année la quatrième de ses conférences, à Erevan (du 1er au 4 octobre 2020) sous le thème "Shakespeare et le pouvoir"

De nos jours, l'affection pour Shakespeare persévère en Arménie où les prénoms dans les œuvres du dramaturge sont abondants, surtout inspirés de la pièce *Hamlet*.
