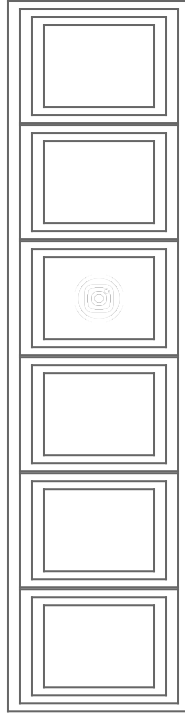

Dr. Diana Ter-Ghazaryan discusses her acclaimed work on Yerevan, Armenia, as well as presents her newest work on public art, monuments and memory in South Florida.

Dr. Ter-Ghazaryan is a GIS specialist, educator, researcher and thought leader in geospatial data visualization and analysis. In her current position as faculty research associate at Florida International University's GIS Center, she engages with the university community to incorporate geospatial technology in all levels of teaching, research and operations. Her scholarly work has focused on urban landscapes, and how national identity and social memory are inscribed onto those landscapes. Her current projects are at the intersection of geospatial technology and geo-humanities, with a focus on cultural heritage, monuments and public art in urban contexts. She holds a PhD in International Relations and Geography with a Graduate Certificate in GIS and Remote Sensing, as well as a Master's in Environmental Studies.
