Awards and competitions

In 2012, he represented Austria at the [Eurovision Young Musicians](#) contest.^[1]

In September 2014, Tjeknavorian was the first Austrian to make it to the final round in the history of the Fritz Kreisler Competition,^[2] where he won third place.^[3] In November 2014, he received the Casinos Austria Rising Star Award.^[4] In December 2015, he placed second in the [International Jean Sibelius Violin Competition](#).^{[5][6]}
